MHA Recognises Cybersecurity as Top Priority in Building a Secure India

The National Cyber Security Awareness Month was observed across the country in October. On the culmination of the event, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) in a statement, expressed its unwavering commitment to establishing a cyber-safe India, recognising the global significance of cyber security. Highlighting the success of various initiatives on this front, the MHA noted that the Indian Cyber crime Coordination Centre (I4C) has been addressing cybercrime in a systematic and comprehensive manner by enhancing coordination among various law enforcement agencies and stakeholders. A significant achievement of the centre has been the citizen-centric National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP) introduced in 2019. The portal has played a pivotal role in enabling citizens to report cybercrimes, with over 29 lakh complaints logged to date. Furthermore, the MHA highlighted the success of the National Cybercrime Helpline (number 1930), which has enabled common citizens to report online financial frauds.
