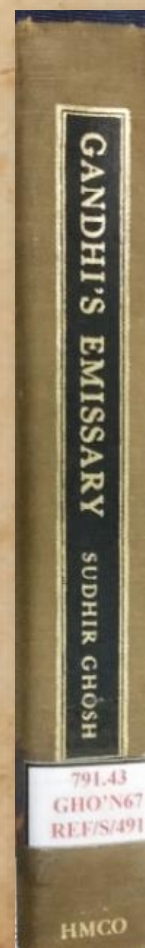
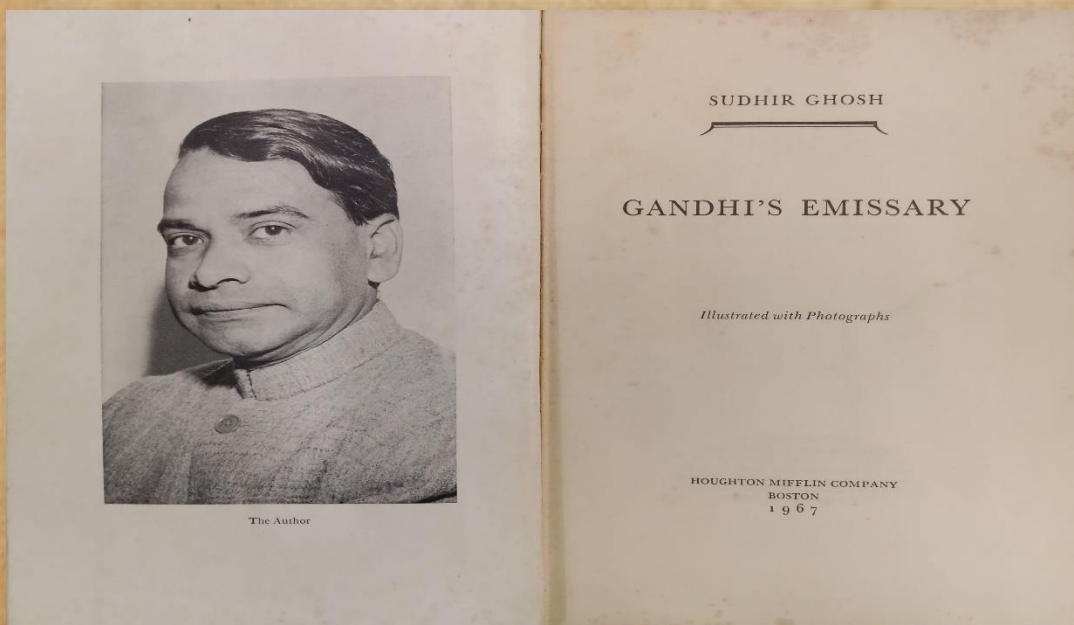
Gandhi's Emissary

- By Sudhir Ghosh

Sudhir Ghosh's "Gandhi's Emissary" provides a poignant memoir detailing his role as a key intermediary between Mahatma Gandhi and the British Labour government during the critical years of 1945-1947. The book highlights Ghosh's effective communication with influential figures such as Clement Attlee and Stafford Cripps, often bypassing bureaucratic hurdles to relay urgent messages that the Congress could not.

Beyond its political narrative, the memoir deals with the personal tragedies of the period, notably the growing estrangement between Gandhi and his successors, Jawaharlal Nehru and Vallabhbhai Patel. Ghosh illustrates Gandhi's loneliness as he witnessed his vision of India being compromised in the face of Partition. The text further critiques the failures of post-independence foreign policy, with Ghosh recounting his diplomatic mission to the United States, where he sought military assistance from President John F. Kennedy in light of the Sino-Indian tensions leading to war in 1962.

Ultimately, the memoir presents a nuanced, humanized account of India's struggle for independence, shedding light on the private conflicts and alliances that influenced the formation of modern India.

The Odyssey of Healing: A Global History of Medicine and Surgery

The history of medicine spans 10,000 years and highlights humanity's determination to overcome physical limits. It has developed from prehistoric practices to precise robotic techniques. To understand modern healthcare, we need to follow these historical steps as our ancestors sought to understand life and death.

The Primitive Era: Magic, Instinct, and the First Incisions

In early medicine, there was no distinction between healing and religion. Illness was often seen as a supernatural curse or a punishment from the gods. As early as 10,000 BCE, people performed trepanation, where they drilled holes in skulls to free "demons." Evidence of bone healing shows that many patients survived these risky procedures. Early healers also created a "global pharmacopeia" by using plants like poppy for pain relief and clay for skin problems.

The Pre-Christian Era: The Rise of Great Civilizations

Different civilizations contributed in the medical sciences at a great impact. Ancient civilizations like Egypt, Indian, Chinese had the tremendous contribution in the development of modern drug and surgery system.

I. Ancient Egypt: The Edwin Smith Papyrus documented medical practices and recognized that the heart acted as a distribution centre while the brain-controlled movement.

II. Mayan civilization: Surgeons in Mesoamerica used obsidian blades, which were sharper than modern steel, and sutured wounds with human hair.

III. Ancient Greece: Hippocrates moved medicine toward a more rational approach, arguing that diseases had natural causes. His theory of the Four Humours introduced homeostasis, an idea still important in medicine today.

IV. Ancient Rome: The Romans focused on public health, creating sewers like the Cloaca Maxima and building aqueducts. They also established the first military hospitals and a system for triage.

V. India and China: Sushruta, around 600 BCE, wrote about over 300 surgical procedures, including rhinoplasty with the "Indian Flap" technique. In China, variolation, a precursor to vaccines, was introduced, and Artemisinin was discovered to treat malaria.

The Era After Christ (AD): From the Middle Ages to the Renaissance

Islamic scholars such as Ibn Sina and Al-Zahrawi preserved ancient medical knowledge. Al-Zahrawi notably discovered catgut for stitches. During the Renaissance, Andreas Vesalius created the first accurate map of human anatomy, while William Harvey uncovered how blood circulates, demonstrating that the heart functions as a pump.

The 1800s: The Triple Revolution like Anesthesia in 1846 ended pain during surgery; Germ Theory in the 1860s identified microorganisms as causes of infection; and Antisepsis in 1867 established sterile environments in hospitals, cutting mortality rates from 50% to nearly zero.

In the 20th Century, The discovery of Penicillin in 1928 marked the end of the era dominated by bacterial infections. Advances in medical imaging, like X-rays and MRIs, allowed doctors to examine the body without surgery. The 1953 discovery of the DNA double helix shifted the focus of medicine to the molecular level.

The Modern Era: The Frontier of Data and Genetics

Today, we are in the age of Personalized Medicine, where gene editing holds the potential to eliminate hereditary diseases. With robotic surgery and AI-based diagnosis, modern healthcare is a collective effort that merges ancient surgical techniques and drug principles with cutting-edge technology. All the thanks to the year after year, impactful research of the mankind and eager of knowledge of human.
