43 StartUps, Incubators, & Accelerators Conferred National StartUp Awards 2022

The Startup India Innovation week culminated with felicitation of Winners of National StartUp Awards 2022 on National StartUp Day on 16th January 2023. As many as 43 StartUps were presented awards, while two incubators and an accelerator were also felicitated for their contribution in their respective sectors. As many as 2,667 applications were received from StartUps, incubators and accelerators across 31 States and Union Territories. Karnataka led the charts as 18 StartUps based in the state emerged winners, followed by Maharashtra (9 winners) and Delhi (4 winners). The Awards acknowl-



edges StartUps and enablers who have been instrumental in revolutionizing the development story of India and in demonstrating exceptional capabilities not just in terms of financial gains but also for the measurable impact on society.

INTERNATIONAL

India Hosts Voice of Global South Summit' with Virtual Participation of 1204

India hosted the first 'Voice of Global South Summit' on 12th January 2023. Addressing the inaugural session, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said, "We developing countries are also concerned about the increasing fragmentation of the international landscape. These geopolitical tensions distract us from focusing on our development priorities. They cause sharp swings in international prices of food, fuel, fertil-



izers and other commodities. To address this geopolitical fragmentation, we urgent ly need a fundamental reform of the major international organisations, including the United Nations Security Council and the Bretton Woods Institutions. These reforms should focus on giving voice to the concerns of the developing world, and reflect the realities of the 21st Century. India's G20 Presidency will attempt to voice the views of the Global South on these important issues." The Summit saw the participation of more than 120 developing countries - the largest-ever virtual gathering of the Global South

India Extends Assurance towards Debt Restructuring of Crisis-Hit Sri Lanka

External Affairs Minister Dr. S Jaishankar has said India will stand by Sri Lanka in its hour of need to overcome the challenges it currently faces. He added that India has taken proactive steps and extended financial assurances to the IMF (International Monetary Fund) without waiting for the other creditors. He said this during his official visit to Sri Lanka. With this announcement, India has become the first creditor nation to extend assurance towards restructuring the debt of Sri Lanka as the island nation makes efforts to unlock a bridge financing package from IMF.

UNSC Declares LeT's Abdul Rehman Makki as Global Terrorist

The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) has listed Pakistan-based terrorist Abdul Rehman Makki as a global terrorist. Makki is the brother-in-law of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) chief and 26/11 mastermind Hafiz Saeed. The development comes after India last year slammed China for blocking the proposal to list Makki under the Sanctions Committee Makki, who has been involved in raising funds, recruiting



and radicalizing the youth to plan attacks in India, especially in Jammu and Kashmir, has already been listed as a terrorist by India and the United States Makki has been in various leadership roles within LeT.

68 Killed as Nepal's Yeti Airlines Plane Crashes into River Gorge

68 people lost their lives in a plane crash in Nepal's Pokhara on 15th January 2023. According to reports, the ill-fated Yeti Airlines flight bound for Pokhara from Kathmandu was close to landing when it crashed into a river gorge on the bank of the Seti River. A total of 72 passengers, including four crew members, were onboard at the time of the crash. According to the Nepal Civil Aviation Authority, the passengers include five Indians, 53 Nepalese, four Russians, one Irishman, one Australian, one Argentinian, two Koreans, and one French citizen.

es Go Ahead to 3 GatiShakti Pro rk Planning Group Give

The Network Planning Group, NPG, constituted under the PM GatiShakti National Master Plan has examined and recommended three projects for implementation. These three projects include a 4-Lane Accessed Controlled Greenfield Highway as part of the Nagpur-Vijaywada corridor, new rail connectivity projects connecting Barejadi Nandej to Sanand in Gujarat, and Barbil, Barsuan and Nayagrah in Odisha. The 4-lane project will improve connectivity to 21 economic nodes, such as mega food parks, fishing seafood clusters and pharma clusters. The proposed alignment of the highway is also estimated to increase average speed from 40 kmph to 80 kmph, reduce travel time from 17 hours to 8 hours and create 11.9 crore employment opportunities after completion. Regarding the Barejadi Nandej to Sanand railway project, the NPG observed that construction of a 4th line is essential to achieve overall operational efficiency between the Viramgam-Sabaramati-Ahmedabad-Geratpur sections as the Ahmedabad station has been one of the busiest stations on the Western Railway Corridor for freight movement. Meanwhile, the proposed Barbil-Barsuan-Nayagarh Railway line, covering a distance of 181 km, will connect major iron mines in the region and boost steel trade in Eastern India. The proposed alignment will see 15 new stations being built in the vicinity of major mining sights such as Sundergarh and Keonihar.

Domestic Air Passenger Traffic Grows by 47.05% in 2022 Compared to 2021

Domestic Air passengers' traffic registered an annual growth of 47.05 percent during the last year in comparison to the corresponding period of January to December 2021. In a report, Directorate General of Civil Aviation stated that passengers carried by domestic airlines during January to December 2022 were 1232.45 lakhs as against 838.14 lakhs during the correspon



ding period of 2021. The DGCA said, a total of 408 passenger related complaints had been received by the scheduled domestic airlines during last month. The major reasons for complaints are flight problems and refunds

Yuki Bhambri and Saketh Myneni Win Bangkok Open Doubles Title

In the finals of the Bangkok Open 2023 on 14th January, top seeds Yuki Bhambri and Saketh Myneni registered a thundering win in the doubles final, with their reputation enhanced, as they recorded a 2-6, 7-6(7), [14-12] victory over Christopher Rungkat and Akira Santillan in the \$80,000 Challenger tennis tournament. The champion team collected 75 ATP points and \$4,645. The runners-up won 50 points and \$2,700. It was the sixth Challenger title as a pair for Yuki and Saketh who had won five last year. With both of them in the top-100 of



the world doubles rank, Yuki and Saketh would aim to break into the ATP tournaments and Grand Slam events this season. (Source: AIR/PIB)
