

### ABSTRACT

This study assesses the level of knowledge about road safety rules among first-year GNM students at the Institute of Nursing, Brainware University. The research focuses on analysing and interpreting data collected from 50 female students, using descriptive statistics. The study aims to understand the demographic background of the students, including their age, education level, and family occupation, and their prior exposure to road safety education. Findings reveal that the majority of students (82%) are in the 18-20 age group, with most living in urban areas and using public transport. In terms of road safety knowledge, 52% of respondents scored in the medium range, with the highest frequency of marks falling between 15-16. The study highlights the need for increased awareness and education on road safety for nursing students, as a substantial portion of respondents demonstrated average knowledge. The results emphasize the importance of integrating road safety education into the curriculum to promote safer practices among future healthcare professionals.
