Cold origins

■ A surprising new study in *The Conversation* suggests the earliest primates didn't originate in tropical forests but in cold, dry parts of North America. Some may have even survived seasonal Arctic conditions by slowing their metabolism or hibernating. Researchers found that dramatic climate shifts, rather than warmth, played a major role in primate evolution and expansion. The discovery reshapes our understanding of how our lineage began.
